Rules and Regulations

All entries must be delivered to the Gertrude Herbert Institute of Art, 506 Telfair Street, Augusta, GA, on Thursday, February 13, or Friday, February 14, 2020 between 10 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Works must have been completed within the current school year. A copy of the application on the back of this form must be completed legibly and attached to each submitted artwork. Please photocopy the required number of applications.

- Artwork must be created entirely by the student.
- Two- and three-dimensional artwork may be submitted.
- Include a summary list of all entries in addition to labeling the works individually.
- Only one entry per student is permitted
- Three entries per division will be accepted from each participating school.
- Two-dimensional entries must not be larger than 18 x 24 inches (excluding matting). Artwork that is threedimensional is restricted to a base size no larger than 15 x 15 inches.
- Entries must be matted and firmly secured to backing board and available to hang for the duration of the exhibition.
- Artwork mounted in heavy frames and/or under glass will not be accepted.
- Teachers of students receiving awards will be notified.

All artwork submitted should be picked up by the teacher, <u>not</u> the student or their family, Monday – Thursday, March 23 – March 26, 2020 between the hours of 10:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
